Re: Access Request #18-0968

I am responding to your request for access to personal information under the *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.

Specifically, you've requested access to all records related to Sheida Aletratikhosroshahi.

Following careful consideration a decision has been made to refuse to confirm or deny the existence of any record pursuant to section 8(3) and 14(5) of the *Act*. I have enclosed copies of the relevant section of the *Act* for your reference.

In the event that you wish to launch an appeal, please provide the Commissioner's office with the following:

- 1) the file number listed at the beginning of this letter;
- 2) a copy of this decision letter; and
- 3) a copy of the original request for information which you sent to this institution.

In addition, you must send an appeal fee to the Commissioner's office. If your request is for access to personal information the appeal fee is \$10.00. If your request is for general information the appeal fee is \$25.00. You must include the fee in your letter of appeal-- appeals fees should be in the form of either a cheque or a money order, made payable to the Minister of Finance.

14(5) A head may refuse to confirm or deny the existence of a record if disclosure of the record would constitute an unjustified invasion of personal privacy. R.S.O. 1990, c.M.56, s. 14(5)
