On Monday February 27, 2006 at approximately 1441 hours police received a call to attend 50 Disera Drive unit 1211 in the City of Vaughan.

Information obtained was that a female had possibly taken some pills in a suicide attempt.

At 1447 hours police arrived on scene and spoke with EMS personnel who were present. They advised that the female inside the residence, ALETRATIKHOSOSHANI, Sheida was visibly upset, but was not injured and that it did not appear that she had ingested any pills.

Police spoke with Sheida and were able to ascertain that she was in a previous relationship with VAZIRI, Ali but that the relationship had been discontinued from 5 months prior. Police then spoke with Ali who was the complainant in this incident. He advised that today he had received a call from Sheida and could not hear anything on the phone and that he feared that she was taking pills in an attempt to commit suicide. Ali stated that Sheida had done this before and was assessed under the Mental Health Act previously.

Ali showed up at Sheida's residence to check on her well being and he was denied access into the building by security. It was learned that phone calls were being made continuously between both parties for some time, yet neither wished to continue in any form of a relationship.

When speaking to Sheida she expressed her feelings towards Ali, which was the reason for her being upset. She stated that she did not ingest any pills and was not suicidal. This was later confirmed by her roommate VAVERI, Nazanin. Sheida stated that she would be leaving tomorrow to visit her parents in Argentina.

It should be noted that neither party wishes to re-establish any relationship, however for some time there has been repeated communication between both parties which has led to arguments between both individuals. There was no physical contact between either party.

Both parties were cautioned not to communicate with each other for the remainder of the day, and it was suggested to Sheida that she seek out counselling to help deal with her feelings.
